LEFSCHETZ ZETA FUNCTION AND TOPOLOGICAL ENTROPY

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Abstract. In this paper we study the dynamical consequences of simple algebraic properties of the Lefschetz zeta function $Z_f(t)$ associated to a continuous self-map f: M - M of a compact manifold M, which is always a rational function P(t)/Q(t). We show that there is a relation between the parity of the degrees of P(t) and Q(t) and the finiteness of the set of periodic points of f on one hand, and vanishing topological entropy on the other (Theorems 5 and 6)

Given a continuous self-map f of a compact manifold M of dimension n, its Lefschetz number is defined as

$$L(f) = \sum_{k=0}^{n} (-1)^k \operatorname{tr} (f_{*k}),$$

where $f_{\star k}: H_k(M; \mathbb{Q}) \to H_k(M; \mathbb{Q})$ is the endomorphism induced by f on the k-th rational homology group of M. The Lefschetz fixed point theorem says that if $L(f) \neq 0$ then f has a fixed point. For the purpose of studying the whole set of periodic points of f, it is useful to consider the Lefschetz zeta function

$$Z_f(t) = \exp\left(\sum_{m=1}^{\infty} \frac{L(f^m)}{m} t^m\right).$$

which is a generating function for the Lefschetz numbers of all iterates of f and can be computed from the homological endomorphisms f_{*k} of f as follows

(1)
$$Z_f(t) = \prod_{k=0}^n \det \left(I_{j_k} - t f_{*k} \right)^{(-1)^{k+1}},$$

where $j_k = \dim_{\mathbb{Q}} H_k(M; \mathbb{Q})$, see [F1] for more details. The following theorem is due to Fried (see Theorem 6 of [F2]).
